

PRACTICE THE GOSPEL

Gospel Visual: Participant Handout

Use this after your leader has taught the gospel visual. Keep your Gospel Visual sheet in front of you.

PRACTICE

Pair up with someone in your group. Take turns explaining the gospel illustration to each other — point to the visual you drew, or draw it again from memory as you talk. Open with one of the conversation starters your leader shared, and help each other out if someone gets stuck. *This is practice, not a test. No one is expected to do it perfectly.*

FEEDBACK

After each person shares, answer these two questions together:

- 1. What did you like about the way they shared it?**
- 2. What is one thing that would make it stronger? Example: More confidence, adding a verse, slowing down, condensing.**

DISCUSS

Once everyone has had a turn, work through these together.

- 1. Have you ever heard the gospel explained like this before?**
- 2. What was helpful about this model? What was challenging?**
- 3. Where would you place yourself in this visual? Explain.**
- 4. Imagine you have just walked someone through the visual and they say, "I want that — what do I do?" What would you say next?**

REFLECT & CONNECT

Sharing the gospel out loud is almost always awkward the first time. That is not a sign you are unprepared — it is what learning sounds like. Confidence grows through practice, not through waiting until you feel ready. And remember, our job is to be faithful and willing; God is the one who does the saving.
